#### **ALL KINGS**

is a peer-led group dedicated to supporting mental health, processing trauma, and developing leadership for justice-impacted and at-risk men.

#### **BENGALI MENTAL HEALTH MOVEMENT**

is a mental health-focused organization committed to destigmatizing the culturally sensitive topic of mental health within the Bengali community.

#### CAMBIO LABS

provides educational technology and curricular programs that transform community members into founders of organizations driven by social and environmental missions.

improves educational outcomes for youth with current or past involvement in the child welfare, homeless, and juvenile justice systems through mental health and academic support.

# ANCHOR PROJECTS

#### **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PROJECT**

protects the rights of intimate partner violence survivors to allow for a self-determined and safe future.

#### **EXPERIENCE JUSTICE**

uses a range of tools to advise and work for social change while mentoring the next generation of activist attorneys.

#### FREE TO BE YOUTH PROJECT

interrupts the cycles of poverty and criminalization that prevent LGBTQ+ young people from living fulfilling lives free from discrimination, abuse, and oppression.

#### **FREEDOM AGENDA**

a member-led project, dedicated to organizing those directly impacted by incarceration to achieve decarceration and system transformation.

#### **MENTAL HEALTH PROJECT**

works to enforce the rights of low-income New Yorkers with mental health concerns.

#### **SAFETY NET PROJECT**

advocates to ensure access to public benefits for low-income New Yorkers; defends tenants against eviction & provides legal support for tenant organizing campaigns; and supports & organizes with homeless New Yorkers.

#### **SEX WORKERS PROJECT**

provides legal services, advocacy, education, and organizing for the human rights of sex workers.

#### **STREET VENDOR PROJECT**

works to correct social and economic injustice faced by NYC street vendors.
